

As we say to our new neighbors, "Welcome aboard! You will love these programs!"

A long awaited phone call from ADOT sent us down to Tempe to pick up our newest van. It is a 10 passenger Cuta-way van with a lift. This new van was named

for Barb Budris who passed away this summer. She and Bill were instrumental in getting our program going and in the early years drove and assisted on many of the trips. Barb was a regular with Bill on the van until she became too ill this past winter. We all miss her dearly.

The arrival of the 'BB' brings our fleet up to four, our first van that we bought 5 years ago affec-

tionately called 'Old Van", our wonderful little Toyota Sienna, the Accessible Van that seats 9 and out new 'BB', as we call it. This fleet gives us the versatility that we have needed for our programs. The older 12 passenger van, the new 'BB' and the Toyota will be used most often in the Van Program for trips. The Accessible van will be Maggie Palmer's to schedule for medical transportation for those with handicapping conditions.

The 'BB' is a beautiful van and so useful. It has a nice wide center isle that allows for easy access to seats as well as that great open space our neighbors fill with laughter and conversation. The lift is in a handy position as well and

the new securement system is much easier than our first accessible van. It did not take us long to decide to refit our first lift van with the updated securements. Everyone will appreciate the helpful changes!

Our transportation program continues to grow. Several of our riders have signed up for almost twenty trips in December and Maggie is now able to transport wheelchair bound neighbors to appointments on most any day requested. As we say to our new "Welcome neighbors. aboard! You will love these programs!" In this season of Thanksgiving we are thankful for ADOT and all our volunteers and donors who make these services possible.

Safe Driving Over the Holidays



Driving distractions impair drivers' abilities to keep their eyes on the • road, their hands on the wheel, and their minds on the task of driving.

Consider the following to help avoid distracted driving:

 Turn off, or at least turn down, the ringer on cell phones and other communication

- devices before driving
- Pull over to a safe location and stop the vehicle prior to using a communication device if one must be used
- Avoid unnecessary adjusting of vehicle settings (e.g., mirrors, temperature controls, radio, and GPS navigation) once the vehi-

- cle is in motion.
- Make sure drivers are well rested, well nourished, and otherwise equipped for the length and purpose of their trip
- Take the time to prepare in advance for the driving trip so as to avoid uncertainty or confusion regarding the routes, stopping points, pickups, etc.


