Foothills Caring Corps' Van Fleet Update



December 9th Foothills Caring Corps added our 4th ADOT Van to our fleet which gives us a total of 5 vans. The newest vehicle in the fleet is "The Dodge." It is a modified Caravan with a very simple lift and perfect for the medical transportation trips for our Neighbors with disabling conditions. The ramp makes it very easy for those in wheelchairs or those who can walk up with no steps involved. This van comes to us at a time when we find our transportation needs increasing based on so many special needs. Through an ADOT RFP grant process we have been awarded all but one of our vans.

Our award for this new year is a larger van that will be a replacement for the first van we bought in 2004. We also received a Mobility Management Grant (the second granted in Maricopa County). This grant is to encourage and support our work with coordinated transportation in the NE area of the county. We have stepped up our support and transport for our Library and the Holland Community Center. We are also looking forward to talking with our local Walmart to partner with them as well as the Veterans Administration. ADOT is trusting us to have our vans used to capacity every day getting people where they need to go. The possibilities are as endless as is the need. In order to meet the needs we are recruiting more van drivers and van assistants. We can use more help. Please consider coming in for an orientation to be trained to drive or assist.
