Foothills Caring Corps chosen by Scottsdale Leadership Team Supporting FCC's Volunteer Recruitment



Scottsdale Leadership's Core Program provides the knowledge, connection, skills and confidence for participants to take on leadership roles in the community. Each year, up to 45 diverse individuals are selected through a competitive process to participate in the 9-month award-winning interactive program. Part of the program involves a competition where the class members are split into teams and compete with each other through 5 innovative community service projects called; "Lead it Forward."

The Scottsdale Leadership team supporting FCC features 9 outstanding individuals that are helping FCC deal with a volunteer shortage. The team has provided FCC with a detailed volunteer recruitment and marketing strategy aimed at fulfilling short and long term needs. In addition to providing a wide range of

recruitment tools and collateral, the team is forging partnerships with local businesses, associations and individuals committed to making a difference.

On April 4, 2014, Scottsdale Leadership won the Audience Choice and Judges Choice awards in the "Lead It Forward" competition. Foothills Caring Corps received the \$2,000 winners prize from Scottsdale Leadership. Scottsdale Leadership created a work plan for volunteer recruitment that now will need a robust PR/marketing committee to implement. The end products beyond this plan such as the brochures, flyers, video, and graphics for social media will need to be distributed to targeted populations.

Elderly and Dehydration

With age, the body loses its ability to detect thirst. Therefore, to stay sufficiently hydrated, elderly people should anticipate the body's needs and not always wait until they are

thirsty to have a drink. To prevent dehydration, it may be best to drink on a regular basis. Ideally, elderly people should get into the habit of drinking one or two glasses of beverage with each meal and drink occasionally during the day when they aren't eating.

Usually people drink when they are thirsty, and simply relying on the thirst signal will normally ensure that they drink enough to stay well hydrated. But by the age of 60, if people only drink when they are thirsty, they may not get as much water as they need. The problem continues to get worse as they get older.

Dehydration can cause serious problems in older adults. Elderly people are at greatest risk of dehydration and its potentially life-threatening consequences. People aged between 85-99 years are six times more likely to be hospitalized for dehydration than those aged 65-69 years. Mild dehydration may also cause conditions such as constipation.
